INTERNATIONAL FAMILY DAY

In 1993, the United Nations passed a resolution to showcase the determination of the organization to encourage better living standards and social progress of families across the globe.

In 1994, the United Nations officially declared the International Day of Families in response to the changing economic and social structures that are affecting the stability and structure of family units in different parts of the world.

International Day of Families basically celebrates the fact that families are the central part of any society.

Why Is World Family Day Celebrated?

This day is celebrated with a dual purpose in mind – to raise awareness of the significance of families and the different aspects that are negatively affecting this unit. It acknowledges the power and abilities of what is considered the most basic unit of society in several parts of the world.

Each year, the day is used as a launch pad to highlight the issues plaguing families and the appropriate actions individuals, societies and the governments can take in order to resolve said issues. The day is also used to showcase how a strengthened family unit eventually helps strengthen societies and nations.

Access to education addresses many of the other issues that impact women, including domestic violence, trafficking, teen dating violence, homelessness, teen pregnancy, and sexual assault.

Education allows women to develop the skills that command decent wages, giving them the freedom to avoid and leave unsafe situations as they have the resources to make their own decisions.

Investing in women's education provides a more even playing field for women to pursue opportunities in the workforce, leading to economic empowerment.

Education enables women to command higher wages in the workforce, increasing their standard of living for themselves and their families. When women control more of the household income, more money is spent on their children's education and healthcare, and children are better educated and healthier.

Greater gender equality boosts country-wide economic growth. The economic empowerment of women is not just the right thing to do, but the smart thing to do, as it is an investment that benefits individuals, households, communities, and countries.

The Live Your Dream Education & Training Award is a monetary award that was established by Soroptimist International of the Americas in 1972 to assist women entering re-entering or the workforce in obtaining the education and skills training they improve their need to employment status. These awards are designed to give women heads of household, who provide the primary source of financial for support their families, the opportunity to achieve their career goals, an opportunity they have not previously had, whether because of economic or social barriers or personal circumstances. These awards are for women who are attending, or have been accepted to, a vocational/skills training program or an undergraduate degree program.

HISTORY WALK



The original Bicentennial History Walk was dedicated during a ceremony held on December 7, 1976, as a gift from SI Riverside to the City of Riverside.

Did you know that when SI Riverside celebrated its 50th anniversary, it rededicated the Bicentennial History Walk to the City of Riverside. A wonderful ceremony was held on April 10, 1998, in the Forest of Lights Plaza, the original location of the History Walk.

Then members of the club and community walked down the Main Street Mall to the Mission Inn to enjoy a celebratory dinner in the Music Room where the club held its inaugural meeting.

For the rededication ceremony, new booklets were prepared and then President Glenda Lanford Richards prepared an Epilogue, which appears as the last page of the updated booklets. The Epilogue reads:

"The Riverside History Walk Booklet is being reprinted at the request of the Fauth family and others in the community. Mrs. Betty Fauth, who passed away earlier this year, was the artist who designed and researched the plaques.

On April 10, 1998, in recognition of the 50th Anniversary of the chartering of Soroptimist International of Riverside, the History Walk was rededicated and once again presented to the City of Riverside.

Rededication plans also included reprinting copies and making said copies of this booklet available to the Riverside Unified School District. RUSD agreed to include it as part of the district's history curriculum for all 3rd grade students. Additional copies will be given to city libraries, University of California Riverside, Riverside Community College and other institutions of learning.
