HIGHLIGHTS AND MILESTONES SINCE 1948

<u>1948:</u> SI Riverside is chartered in the Music Room at the Mission Inn on April 10, 1948.

<u>1955:</u> Club members deliver Civil Defense information packets to Riverside homes.

<u>1955:</u> \$100 scholarship given to a nursing student to help defer education costs.

<u>1955:</u> Materials cabinet donated to the Braille Auxiliary Institute.

<u>1956:</u> Club members plant a tree at the California School for the Deaf.

<u>1956:</u> Hosts a member from the Soroptimist Club in Edinburgh, Scotland.

<u>1959:</u> Playground equipment donated to Mathews Cottage.

1960: \$200 scholarship given to a woman attending college to defer her education costs.

<u>1972:</u> Establishes the Riverside Area Rape Crisis Center with SI Riverside members serving on the board of directors.

<u>1972</u>: First Gold Key Award given to a woman with 20 years volunteer service to local community.

1972: First Live Your Dream Education & Training Award (Called the Training Awards Program in 1972) given to a woman head of household who provides the primary source of financial support for her family so she can have the opportunity to achieve her career goals.

<u>1973:</u> SI Riverside, Altrusa and Zonta clubs collectively hold a drawing for a new car to raise funds to build a therapy pool.

<u>1973:</u> SI Riverside's Youth Citizenship Award winner is recognized at the Pacific Region Spring Conference.

<u>1976:</u> The History Walk, the bicentennial project of SI Riverside, is dedicated in the Forest of Lights at Raincross Square. History Walk consists of 29 engraved stones that memorialize Riverside's historical events.

<u>1977:</u> History Walk wins accolades from California Historical Societies.

1982: \$350 Training Awards Scholarship given to a woman to further her education.

<u>1982:</u> History Walk becomes part of 2nd grade curriculum with students making tracings of stones describing Riverside history.

1985: Monetary donation given to Riverside Children's Museum.

<u>1987:</u> Scholarships given to three woman who are currently attending college or vocational school.

1990: A van is donated to the YWCA Born Free Program for drug dependent pregnant women.

1991: Monetary donation to Tech Trek.

<u>1992:</u> Sponsors a Venture Club to provide guidance to young women entering the professional world.

<u>1992:</u> Monetary donation to Janet Goeske Senior Center.

<u>1993:</u> Monetary donation given to Genesis Shelter Services.

1994: Monetary donation given to Meals on Wheels.

<u>1996:</u> Holds first Soroptimist Golf Benefit at Canyon Crest Country club.

1997: First annual Valentine Dessert Auction and Battle of the Bakers is held at the Holiday Inn.

1997: Monetary donation sent to an orphanage in Belarus.

<u>1998:</u> 50th Anniversary is celebrated with a banquet in the Music Room at the Mission Inn.

<u>1998:</u> The Soroptimist Rose Garden is dedicated in front of the Riverside County Court House.
